CD-ROM Interface

The CD-ROM interface that auto-launches once inserted into the computer will help you navigate easily between the PowerPoint slides, the slide annotations and the reference list. However, all the files may be found separately through your file browser.

To access the files without the auto-launch page, it is suggested to:

MICROSOFT[®] WINDOWS[®] (XP OR GREATER)

- Open the 'My Computer' window usually located on the Desktop
 - Locate and right-click the CD-ROM drive where the FRAX[®] Slide Kit is located, then click **Open**
- A listing of files on the CD-ROM will appear

MAC[®] OS (X OR GREATER)

- Open a new window in 'Finder'
 - Locate and double click the CD-ROM drive where the FRAX[®] Slide Kit is located
- A listing of files on the CD-ROM will appear

NOTE: The interface has been tested on Microsoft[®] Internet Explorer[®] and Mozilla[®] Firefox[®]. However, please note that some web browsers may not open the files directly from the interface; in this case, it is recommended to open the files directly through your file browser.

Inserting the FRAX[®] slides into your PowerPoint presentation

The process of inserting any of the slides you chose into your own PowerPoint presentation is quick and easy. Simply:

- Open the PowerPoint presentation entitled 'FRAX[®] Slides'
- Select which slide(s) you would like to use
- Copy the slide(s) by right-clicking on top of one and then clicking **Copy** (or **Ctrl + C**)
- Open your PowerPoint presentation and paste the copied slide(s) by right-clicking in the spot you wish them to go and then clicking **Paste** (or **Ctrl + V**)

The PowerPoint slides are printable in colour and black and white.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

In order to open and view the slides, you need Microsoft PowerPoint or a similar program compatible with PowerPoint installed on either a Microsoft[®] Windows[®] or Apple[®] Macintosh[®] System.

Inserting the FRAX[®] slides into other documents

All slides are images (.JPEG files) that can be copied and pasted into other documents.
